Sacrament of Confirmation.

Sacrament of Reconciliation.

The sacrament through which God's mercy and love, justice and truth heals the wound of human sin. Generally offered an hour before each Mass - daily and weekend. Please give the priest fifteen minutes before Mass to prepare for Mass.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.

The sacrament through which Jesus continues to heal the sick among us. Anointing is offered at each Mass on the first weekend of the month, or call Fr. Edison @ 924-7111.

Sacrament of Marriage.

The sacrament through which God calls a man and woman to become visible signs of His and His People's love. For inquiries about marriage preparation, call Fr. Edison or Deacon John @ 924-7111.

Sacrament of Holy Orders.

The sacrament through which the mission Jesus entrusted to the apostles is continued in the Church. To learn more about vocations to the ordained ministry, please call Fr. Edison or Deacon John @ 924-7111.

I do hope that you have taken the time to watch Bishop Barron's YouTube video, "What's Our Church's Growth Strategy?" If not, please scan the QR code with your smart phone to access the video.



The good bishop not only recognizes the need to address the current situation of decline in Church, but also and more importantly, understands the need to revisit our nature and ongoing mission as Church.

During the Homily on the Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time, we talked about the Jesus' public ministry as situated between His call of the disciples and His sharing with us His mission to go and make other Christian disciples. In other words, Jesus called us to be blessed by God, so that, sent to the world, we share with others the God who blessed.

Now, why must we pray for the growth of the Church?

- In prayer, God connects us to Himself. We, the branches, can only be fruitful, if and when we remain connected and sustained by the vine. Without God, we can do nothing. And with God, everything is possible.
- To remind ourselves of who we truly are. In loving us, God renders you and me lovable. Once we have experienced this love of God, we cannot but want others to experience this same love. Many in our time people of faith and no faith suffer from lack or poor self-identity. They identify themselves with their own achievements. And when achievements cease, their purpose in life ceases too. Would you want these people to truly understand and experience, first and foremost, the love of God for them?
- To remind ourselves of our mission. We can do a lot by good things in this world, but every good thing that we do must serve the greater purpose of bringing others to God. By our own witness as Christian disciples, we are to make other Christian disciples. Here, we are rediscovering that every Christian disciple is also a missionary. What if at the pearly gates, the question that is asked of us is this - "How many other Christian disciples have you made?"
 What current answer would you give?

Keep yourself engaged in our ongoing conversations on growing the Church, and always begin with prayer.


