In 2023, we are converting most of the growing area to raised beds for higher yields using less water, fertilizer, and — eventually — less manual labor. Most of the seeds and seedlings are planted by the end of May. June through September are largely occupied with weeding, pest control and harvest. In October, we put the garden to bed for the winter.
