Sacrament of Reconciliation. The sacrament through which God's mercy and love, justice and truth heals the wound of human sin. *Generally offered an hour before each Mass*. Please give the priest fifteen minutes before Mass to prepare for Mass.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. The sacrament through which Jesus continues to heal the sick among us. Anointing is offered at each Mass on the first weekend of the month. Or call Fr. Edison @ 924-7111 to schedule an anointing.

Sacrament of Marriage. The sacrament through which God calls a man and woman to become visible signs of His Love. Call Fr. Edison or Deacon John @ 924-7111 for more info.

Sacrament of Holy Orders. The sacrament through which the mission Jesus entrusted to the apostles is continued in the Church. To learn more about vocations to the ordained ministry, please call Fr. Edison or Deacon John @ 924-7111.

Eucharistic Revival Pilgrim's Passport

Spiritual Exercise 3
Listen and Talk
to Jesus Daily

Previously, from Martha and Mary, we learn that listening to Jesus takes precedence over

serving Him. And from the disciples in this Sunday's Gospel, we learn that Jesus teaches and encourages us to pray.

To pray is to listen to God, to Jesus. To pray also provides us the sacred space to open our hearts to God, to Jesus. Do you have a daily prayer life? If yes, then, good. Nurture your daily prayer life. If no, then, pray about having a daily prayer life - as a concrete way of recognizing God in your every day, and acknowledging the need to listen to and talk to God. Here are some easy and practical tips...

- What is your typical day like? When are relatively quiet times that you can spend with God? Some do wake up a little early in the morning for a time with God in prayer.
- To listen to God, consider reading the Gospel reading of the Day. You may use the parish app for this. To download the app, text 'App' to 55321. Prayerfully read the Gospel reading at least three times. What is God saying to you through the reading?
- To talk to God, share with Him what is going on in your life. Based on this, determine how you may put into practice what you read. Remember to pray for those who need your prayers that day.

May your daily time with God in prayer be filled with His love for you and your love for God. Remember every moment spent with God is a moment well-spent.

Thank you, Paul Then and Todd Gillenkirk, for providing update about the parish Synod listening sessions and the planned ongoing discussions.

To facilitate ongoing discussions in the parish, we will be using the monthly Coffee Hour as the proper platform. Why do we need ongoing conversation in the parish? Because the listening sessions yielded very low participation (27 out of 5583 or .005%) - we hope that many more will get involved. And because of some misconceptions, both doctrinal and non -doctrinal, that need to be better understood and responded to - to address these effectively, two-way communication has to happen. Let there be light...

Jesus on Praying

Jesus was praying in a certain place, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray just as John taught his disciples." He said to them, "When you pray, say: Father, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come. Give us each day our daily bread and forgive us our sins for we ourselves forgive everyone in debt to us, and do not subject us to the final test."

- Luke 11:1-4

Previously, Jesus brought to the attention of Martha and Mary the primacy of listening and learning from Him. Immediately after, Jesus is presented as praying, and to their credit, the disciples were observing Jesus. And now, they asked that Jesus teach them how to pray. In response, Jesus both encouraged His disciples to pray and taught them what we now call "The Lord's Prayer."

In Luke's version, "The Lord's Prayer" is shorter, with only five petitions instead of the seven in Matthew. Missing are "... Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven," and "...but deliver us from evil." The former serves as a doublet for "... Your kingdom come," but makes explicit that obedience to God in heaven must manifest on earth as well. And the latter serves as a doublet for "...and do not subject us to the final test," and importantly adds the power of God to save us from evil.

And he said to them, "Suppose one of you has a friend to whom he goes at midnight and says, Friend, lend me three loaves of bread, for a friend of mine has arrived at my house from a journey and I have nothing to offer him,' and he says in reply from within, Do not bother me; the door has already been locked and my children and I are already in bed. I cannot get up to give you anything." I tell you, if he does not get up to give the visitor the loaves because of their friendship, he will get up to give him whatever he needs because of his persistence."

- Luke 11:5-8

In this short parable that follows The Lord's Prayer, Jesus teaches us important points about praying. First, to pray is to acknowledge our utter poverty before God and the utter generosity of God. Second, to pray is to be attentive not only to what have and are able to offer (or lack thereof), but also to others in need. And third, to pray necessitates our persistence and our persistence offers inestimable value to our pray.

From His short parable, Jesus teaches us that prayer can be a powerful tool to remind us of the virtues of humility before God - "God, I depend on You!", of the sense of brotherhood - "God, I cannot ignore my brother in need!", and of persistence - "God, only You can help, and I and my brother are in dire need of Your help!"

"And I tell you, ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you.

Lastly, Jesus brings to our attention that when we pray, the Heavenly Father does not simply grant us something but offers us the Holy Spirit, the very Being of God.

Fellow pilgrims, let us pray for each other, and let us pray without ceasing.
