Guided by Mary's role as Mediatrix of All Graces, members aim to grow closer to Christ by performing apostolic work in pairs, mirroring Mary's humble service and bringing God's love to often forgotten people.

Active Members visit many places each week, such as adult homes, private homes, the VA, and the jail, where we lead in praying the Rosary and Communion Services. We also coordinate the St. Patrick Traveling Chalice and Paten Program to help promote vocations in the Church. We also help with the cleaning of the church basement. At our meetings, we pray together and discuss the apostolic works that we have done that week. Auxiliary members simply read a small prayer pamphlet each day to remain active.
